Welcome to John Long Middle School!

As your child begins to enter the teenage years, his or her educational needs and expectations will begin to change rapidly. Pasco County middle schools offer new and exciting opportunities for children in grades 6-8 specifically designed to meet those needs. Your child will experience school in a whole new way, from working with a team of teachers and traveling from class to class, to exploring technology and languages in electives.

Quick Facts:

- Assistant Principals and Guidance Counselors are assigned to a grade level and loop up with the student's grade every year.
- Assignments for all grades, including incoming 6th graders are assigned over the summer.
- All students have 6 classes each day. As a 6th, 7th or 8th grader, your child's core classes will include Language Arts, Math, Social Studies and Science.
- Students are required to have one semester of physical education (PE) class each year unless enrolled in a remedial course, elective class or participating in physical activities outside the school day at least equal to mandated requirement.
- Accelerated Reading is provided for students who need extra support.
- All 7th and 8th grade students can participate in football, soccer, volleyball, basketball, track & field and cheerleading.
- There are clubs and activities available for all students.

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Academics at JLMS

Students must complete the exit criteria below in order to be promoted to high school:

- Middle school students must successfully complete Math, Language Arts, Science and Social Studies each year to be promoted to high school. Successful completion of these courses require the earning of a grade of "D" or higher.
- Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA.
- Maintain appropriate behavior.
- Maintain regular attendance.

Required Courses

- Each year, all 3 grades are required to pass 4 core courses: Math, Language Arts, Science and Social Studies. Contingent upon FSA Reading score, students may also be required to take an additional Reading course.
- Students must complete one course in career and education planning to be completed in the 7th or 8th grade.
- Physical Education (PE). Middle school students are required to take one semester of PE in each grade level unless waived. Students can rent a locker during their PE semester. Uniforms can be plain white or JLMS spirit shirts with plain black shorts. JLMS shirts can be purchased from the PE department or during orientation day.
- PE may be waived for students for the following criteria:
 - The student is enrolled or required to enroll in a remedial course.
 - The student is enrolled in another elective, if it is available at that grade level and upon parent request.
 - The student is participating in physical activities outside the school day, which are equal to or in excess of the mandated requirement.

Electives for Grade Levels

In addition to the 4 core courses, students in each grade level take 2 other periods of elective courses. These courses include, but are not limited to: Art, Spanish, Chorus, Band, Orchestra, Health and Career & Technical Education.

Peer Program. The Peer Program allows 8th graders to assist teachers, the media, the office or special needs classrooms. This is an elective that students apply for and are chosen in the 7th grade.

Honor Roll

Each semester, using the scale below, grades will be averaged. Those students averaging a 3.2 - 3.9 will be on the honor roll. Those students averaging 4.0 will be on the all A honor roll (*Scale: 4.0 = A; 3.0 = B; 2.0 = C; 1.0 = D; 0 = F*).

Dress Code

Students shall wear modest clothing. Sexually implicit or explicit clothing, bikinis, tank tops, leggings, jeggings, sleepwear including pajamas, spandex clothing are not appropriate for school.

- Students may wear shorts and skirts as long as they are no more than 4" above the knee. The same rule applies to jeans with holes, leggings and dresses.
- Students' clothing shall be worn appropriately with pants worn securely at the waist and with no abdomen/back, side skin or underwear exposed.
- Blouses, shirts, and sweaters cannot dip below a line formed between the right and left armpit. Muscle shirts, tank tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, and strapless tops or see through tops are not acceptable. Tank tops underneath see through or lace shirts are not permitted
- Tops must be long enough to clearly overlap the belt line or stay tucked in during the course of normal movement throughout the school day. NO underwear should be exposed.
- Students shall not wear hats or head coverings on the school campus during the regular school day unless previously approved for medical or religious reasons or special school activities by the Principal.
- Students shall wear shoes for foot protection and hygienic reasons while on school grounds or on school transportation. Slippers are not acceptable.
- Decorations, symbols, mottos, or designs imprinted or attached to the body or clothing which are offensive to good taste or the maintenance of decorum, or which advertise tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or which identify them as members of secret antisocial groups or gangs shall not be worn to school or school functions. Facial piercing (nose, mouth, lip, tongue and eyebrow) are not appropriate at JLMS.
- Wallet chains or dog collars shall not be permitted.

The Principal, or designee, shall determine the appropriateness of dress and appearance and will make the decision if a student's appearance meets the dress code standard. The Principal or designee's decision on the appropriateness of dress is final.

Attendance

JLMS does not have an attendance line. Please send in a note for your child regarding their absence on the first day they return to class. Allow 1-2 weeks for absences to show EXCUSED in myStudent.

Bus Information

The District School Board of Pasco County provides free transportation to and from school for students who live more than two miles away from school. Students will be provided with bus pick up and drop off times on Orientation Day.

Drop Off & Pick Up

To reduce the amount of cars trying to get in and out of the school, the school encourages parents to carpool. Drop off and pick up from the outer right lane only (left lane is for exiting) and please pull all the way up. NO dropping off on Mansfield Blvd.

You can set an account to pay school meals anytime, anywhere from your computer or smartphone by using www.myschoolbucks.com. It is the most convenient way to manage payments.

Tuesday, August 8th. You and your student will be able to pick up his or her class schedule on Orientation Day. Please be prepared to pay for any school or book fees. 6th graders should proceed to the JLMS cafeteria. 7th and 8th graders pick up their schedules in the gymnasium.

- All classes are 50 minutes long
- Lunch is 30 minutes long.

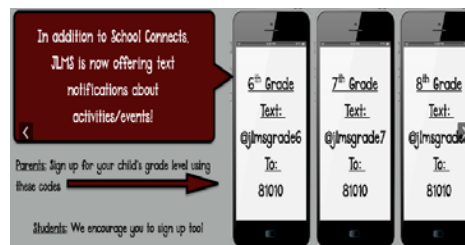

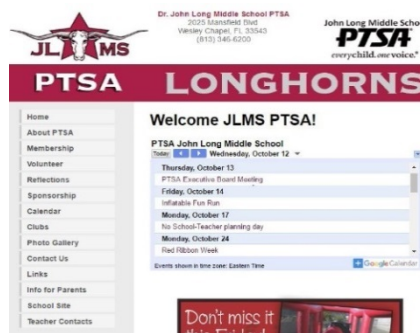

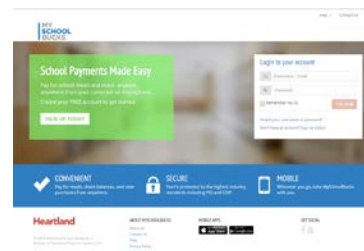

Clubs at John Long

There are several clubs that students can take part in. If a student has a special interest in starting a new club, he or she needs to find a teacher willing to be a sponsor. Students will be given instructions about how to register for clubs during the first few weeks of school.

The following is a list of clubs from the past school year. They are not guaranteed to be available in the 2017-2018 school year.

Best Buddies. The students in the Best Buddies Club help offer social mentoring while improving the quality of life and level of inclusion for a population that is often isolated and excluded. Through their participation, people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities form meaningful connections, gain self-confidence, share interests and activities. 7th and 8th graders only as Peer Buddies.

Debate Team. The debate team is more than an after school club. It's an opportunity for students to find their voice and become effective communicators. Team meets once a week and work closely with the Land O' Lakes High School JSA chapter to learn the art of debate, to become aware of real-world issues, advocate for what they believe and to become leaders in our society.

Fellowship of Christian Students (FCS). Fellowship of Christian Students is a group designed to equip, empower and encourage students to make a difference for Christ. The club meets twice a month in the afternoons.

Healthcare Occupations Students of America (HOSA) Club. HOSA is a national student organization and a club for students who have a desire to learn all about the health occupation. Students also participate in health competitions against other schools.

News Crew. Every morning at 8:30 you can count on the JLMS News Crew to keep you up to date on all the latest Longhorn events. The news crew finds all the controls, transitions and anchoring duties every morning.

Odyssey of the Mind. OM is all about students putting their minds together to creatively solve different tasks. With different problems to choose from, the students are allowed to develop their own teams and can move forward to state competition held at UCF.

Photography Club. Promotes creativity through photography, to share and critique the photographs of peers, to educate and improve skills and to spread the love of photography throughout the Longhorn community. A camera of any kind - cell phone cameras are just fine. Meets once a week.

Step Team. A form of dance where the members' entire body is used as an instrument to create complex sounds and rhythms through a mixture of footsteps, spoken word and hand claps. Tryouts are in August.

Yearbook Club. The yearbook club is made up of 7th & 8th graders who must apply to be in the club at the beginning of the school year.
